MCC(SW/AW) Aaron Glover, a native of New York State, graduated from Germantown Central High School in 1995 and immediately joined the Navy. He reported to Recruit Training Command Great Lakes in September.

Glover attended the Basic Lithographer Course at Fort Belvoir, Virginia. Upon graduation, he reported for his first duty assignment aboard submarine tender, USS Frank Cable (AS 40), where he served as an off-set press operator, binderyman and darkroom technician.

Next, he joined the commissioning crew aboard PCU Harry S. Truman (CVN 75) where he worked as a digital production and graphic arts specialist. During this tour he earned both his Enlisted Surface Warfare and Aviation Warfare Specialist qualifications and was promoted to Lithographer Second Class.

In November 2000, he transferred to the Office of Naval Intelligence, Suitland, Maryland where he served as a graphics specialist, command photographer, production manager and assistant printing officer. Two years later, he was promoted to Petty Officer First Class.

His next assignment was aboard USS Kearsarge (LHD 3) where served as the media division leading petty officer. There, he completed two deployments in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom and was promoted to Chief Petty Officer in 2006.

He was then selected to serve at the Defense Information School, Fort Meade, Maryland. During this tour he served as Basic Mass Communication Specialist Course instructor, Visual Communications Department Non-Commissioned Officer in Charge and Academic Director. In 2010, he earned his Master Training Specialist designation.

Chief Glover is now assigned to Navy Public Affairs Support Element East where he has served as the Senior Enlisted Advisor, Operations Chief and completed deployments onboard USS Cleveland (LPD 7) in support of Pacific Partnership 2011 and to Southeast Asia as CTF-73 PAO for exercise Cooperation Afloat Readiness and Training 2012.

His personal awards include the Defense Meritorious Service Medal, Navy Commendation Medal (2) and Navy Achievement Medal (4).
