Donald W. Randall was born in Louisville, KY. He entered the Navy Reserves on 14 December 2001 and graduated basic training from Great Lakes, IL. After basic training, Randall was assigned to Navy Reserve, Submarine Support Command (NR NSSC), providing operational support as a journalist at the NSSC Public Affairs Office. In 2005 Randall was assigned to NR Defense Information Systems Agency Pacific (DISA-PAC) where he worked as the Admin LPO and provided photographic support. Eight months later he was reassigned to NR Commander Pacific Fleet (COMPACFLT) Det 301 where he provided broadcast and media relations support. While assigned to NR CPF Randall was mobilized three times to Active Duty as an Individual Augmentee (IA). 2006, his first IA, was to Navy Expeditionary Logistics Support Group as a Customs and Border Clearance Agent in Kuwait. The second IA was to Joint Task Force Guantanamo (JTF GTMO) where he worked in the Public Affairs Office specializing in Media Relations. His third IA was to Djibouti where he augmented U.S. Army Security Forces at the Entry Control Points and drove Quick Reaction Force vehicles. Randall is currently assigned to NR Commander Navy Region Hawaii Regional Operation Center (CNRH ROC) and when on orders supports the command as the CNRH ROC/Joint Base Emergency Operations Center (EOC) Public Affairs Officer, Media Chief and ROC watchstander.
