Chief Mass Communication Specialist Joshua L. Treadwell was born on January 10, 1977 in Melbourne, FL. He graduated from Eau Gallie High School in 1996 and immediately entered the U.S. Navy.

Treadwell received recruit training at Great Lakes, IL, where he was selected for his first duty assignment with the U.S. Navy Presidential Guard. Upon completion he attended Basic Still Photography and then was assigned to the USS Dwight D. Eisenhower (CVN 69).

Treadwell left active duty in 2001 and immediately resumed service in the Navy Reserve. While in the Navy Reserve, Treadwell graduated with a Bachelor of Arts from the University Of Central Florida. He has been assigned to numerous reserve commands including ARGIMA, COMSUBGRU 22 and COMSUBGRU 8. On February 12, 2003, Treadwell was mobilized in support of Operation Enduring Freedom and was assigned to NAVEODTECHDIV (WMD), serving in both Iraq and Washington D.C. In 2007 Treadwell was mobilized for two tours at Joint Task Force Guantanamo Bay. Upon return, he was assigned to his parent command, Navy Office of Community Outreach (NAVCO). Treadwell was mobilized in 2010 in support of Operation Enduring Freedom for assignment as the PAO NCOIC for COMISAF General David Petraeus. He served as Gen. Petraeus' photographer/videographer and Public Affairs media expert. Currently, Chief Treadwell is the editor for The Navy Reservist Magazine and is the Senior Enlisted Advisor at NAVCO.

Treadwell's immediate family includes his son Oliver Treadwell.

Treadwell's personal awards include the Defense Meritorious Service Medal, Joint Service Commendation Medal (with oak leaf cluster), Joint Service Achievement, Navy Achievement Medal, and various service and campaign awards.
